An Artistic Declaration



"Reality Show" deals with truth, lies, and manipulation within a years long family relationship. The reality show mainly serves as the background to the family drama, yet can also be seen as a metaphor for life itself - the manipulations, which we have long known to be integral to reality TV, are in fact a regular part of our real life.

At first, Amnon, Edna, and Shir are portrayed as the perfect family, when actually, as far as Edna is concerned, it's all a lie. Therefore, Edna, who has kept the truth to herself to protect the family image, is the manipulator of the story. The truth which she has finally revealed is also the TV "reality" which Nadav was looking for. The fact that reality shows are manipulative is something we have known for a long time, but are they really any more manipulative than real life itself?

In terms of the overall aesthetic of the film, there is a distinct separation between the "objective" perspective of the film itself and the perspective of the television crew. The "objective" perspective includes mostly static shots, which emphasize the tidy and perfect household, while through the TV crew's camera the family is viewed in much more frantic, poorly framed, shots accompanied by the sounds of technical malfunctions instead of the more peaceful sounds of goat bleats. Thus a "rough" family display is created on occasion, an aesthetic which, due to its imperfect nature, additionally imbues a sense of truth and authenticity to the proceedings.

Through this aesthetic there is an attempt to attribute the truth to the deep rifts within the family and portray the image of perfection as false. In the first part of the film, Amnon and Edna are talking about Shir and the family with perfect harmony, where they are mostly seen in the "clean" shots. At this point, the "rough" shots don't quite hold up. In the end, Edna repeats the same stories in a much less harmonious version and is then seen through the TV crew's camera. When the secrets and the burdensome truth rise to the surface, a nearly continuous employment of those same "rough" shots exists, focusing on Edna - the source of truth and manipulation at one and the same time. The transition back towards the "objective" perspective occurs the moment when Edna smiles, since this is where we see the reemergence of all the pretense.

My name is Bar Friedman and I am 31 years old. Ever since I can remember I was attracted to the stage and the theatre. I only got hit with the movie bug later on. One day in the ninth grade I was roaming around the schoolyard and I saw some of my best friends sitting on a bench outside



one of the classrooms. I approached them and I suddenly realized that they were in the middle of a film class. That's just the kind of thing you can expect to happen in a democratic school. So I decided to join them and as it turned out, as cliched as this may sound, that was the moment that changed my life. I fell in love with the craft of filmmaking.
