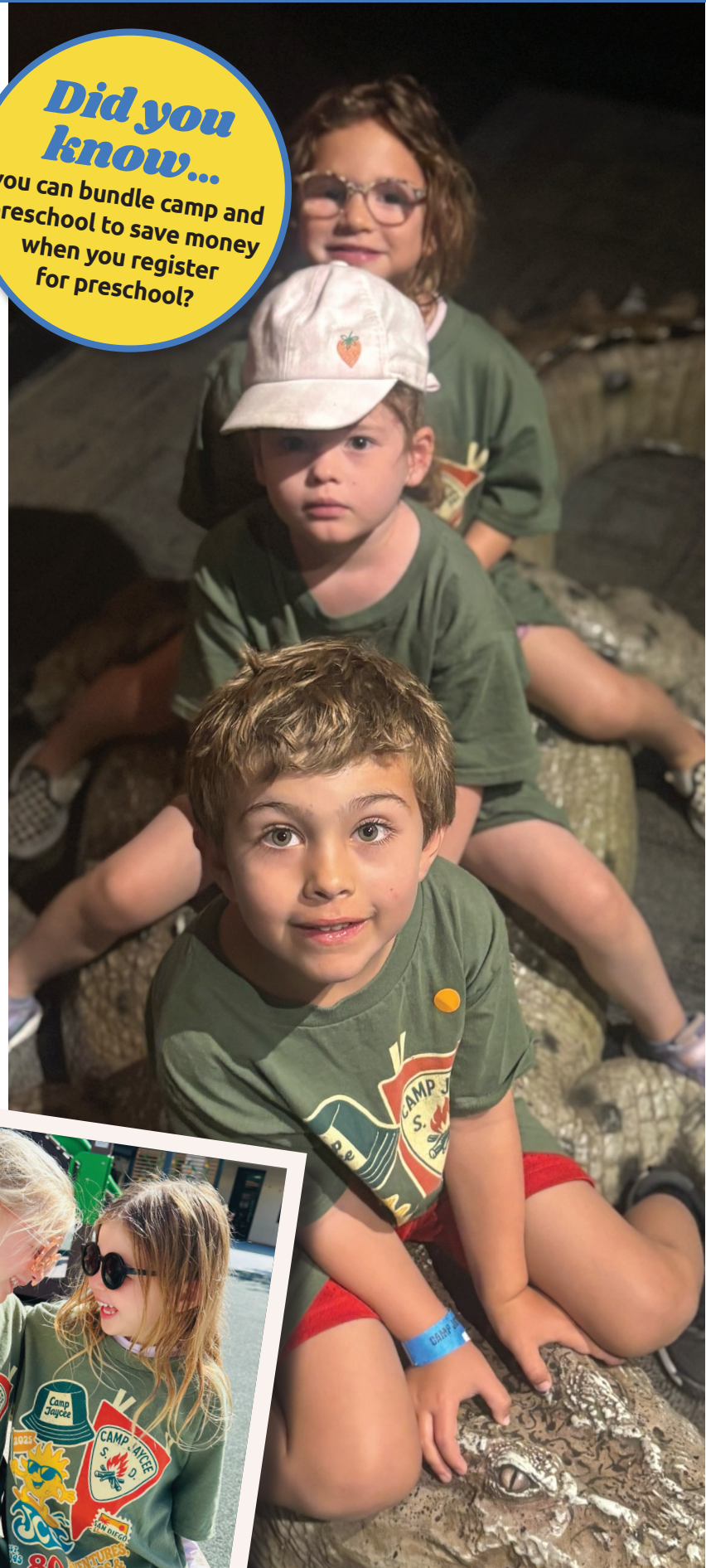

Two 4-week sessions

SESSION 1: June 15–July 10 | Performance: July 9

SESSION 2: July 13–Aug 7 | Performance: Aug 6

Campers sing, dance, and act their way through the summer while playing theatre games, learning key terms, and honing their facial expressions, body language, and projection, all leading to an exciting end-of-session showcase for family and friends.

Pre CAMPS

WEEK 1 | June 1–5

SLIME TIME Grades K–3

In slime camp, we learn how to make slime out of common household items. Slime lovers will have the chance to get their hands dirty by using a variety of different ingredients to make the thickest, ooey-gooiest slime around!

DANCE Grades K–2

Learn a variety of dance styles and about the cultures and traditions that inspired them! Each day campers learn a different dance style from instructors and show off their favorite dance for family and friends at the end of the week!

EXPLORE CODING USING LEGO® SPIKE PRIME SYSTEM Grades K–3

Rise to the challenge to build and program robots using the LEGO® Spike Prime system! Learn about mechanical and software design, loops, conditional statements, problem solving, and teamwork skills. We take them pier fishing and on a half-day boat on the open water after the biggest catches possible. While we encourage campers to bring their own rods, we have loaner rods for those who don't have their own.



Post CAMPS

WEEK 1 | August 10–14

OLYMPIC GAMES Grades K–3

Spend the week competing in different games, sports and activities. Campers earn points and represent their team's country through a variety of events! Do you have what it takes to earn a gold medal?

CERAMICS/ART Grades K–7

This week is all about creativity and hands on fun. Kids will explore clay through slabs, coils, pinch pots, textures, and simple glazing to make both useful and decorative art. We will also use drawing, painting, and mixed media to finish special keepsake pieces of art.

FENCING* Grades 2–6

Camp Jaycee is partnering with Team Touché to help refine free-swinging students into deft deflectors and Z-carving virtuosos. They are challenged to learn French and Italian terminology embedded in this classical sport. With Team Touché, campers glean knowledge and techniques, and pursue whole-body fitness while partaking in engaging activities.

SCI-FI SPACE EXPLORATION Grades 3–6

In this camp,, we imagine the many kinds of adventures that await us among the stars, and bring our imagination to life as we make up new planets, aliens, weapons, and technology that play a part in our own interstellar Sci-Fi adventure! Campers draw inspiration from great Sci-Fi franchises (Star Wars, Star Trek, Dune, Avatar, superhero comics, space westerns, Halo, Aliens, Metroid, etc.) or make a universe all their own!

HORSEBACK RIDING* Grades 3–7

At Rockin' L&D Ranch, campers learn horsemanship and sportsmanship in a fun, safe, and supportive environment. Campers ride daily and discover what it truly takes to care for a horse. The program covers the full spectrum of horsemanship, including understanding horse behavior, grooming, leading, tacking up, Western dressage, traditional Western riding skills, and ranch skills such as goat tying, weighing feed, bathing horses, and cleaning stalls and saddles.

Rockin' L&D Ranch upholds the high standards and protocols of the Certified Horsemanship Association. On the final day, campers participate in a horse show and skills demonstration and a showcase on Friday.

Bus Transportation Grades K-11

Between June 15 and August 7, 2026, limited transportation is available for campers four years and older from designated sites in the following areas (subject to minimum enrollment):

Extended Care

It Started with Camp: **FINDING LOVE & FAMILY AT CAMP JAYCEE**

Lauren & Gabe

Lauren and Gabe grew up in the same JCC world — summers at Camp Jaycee, days in the pool and on the field — but their paths never crossed. That changed one summer, when camp paired them as Hevra counselors and an easy friendship formed, quietly becoming the beginning of the life they share today.

The JCC wasn't just familiar to Lauren, it felt foundational. *"The first JCC experience I had was preschool. I was two years old, in Mommy & Me, and Judy was my teacher,"* Lauren recalls. She attended preschool at the J, performed in JCompany shows like *Oklahoma!* and *The Wiz*, and spent "so many years" in summer camp.

Gabe's childhood meandered through many of the same spaces. He also grew up attending camp, including the eighth-grade overnight program. But, because he is a year younger, their paths didn't cross until the summer after Gabe graduated high school and Lauren returned after her freshman year of college. *"We were both in Hevra, and that's where we got to know each other,"* Lauren says. *"We ended up getting really close that summer... spending all our days in camp together and then hanging out after."*

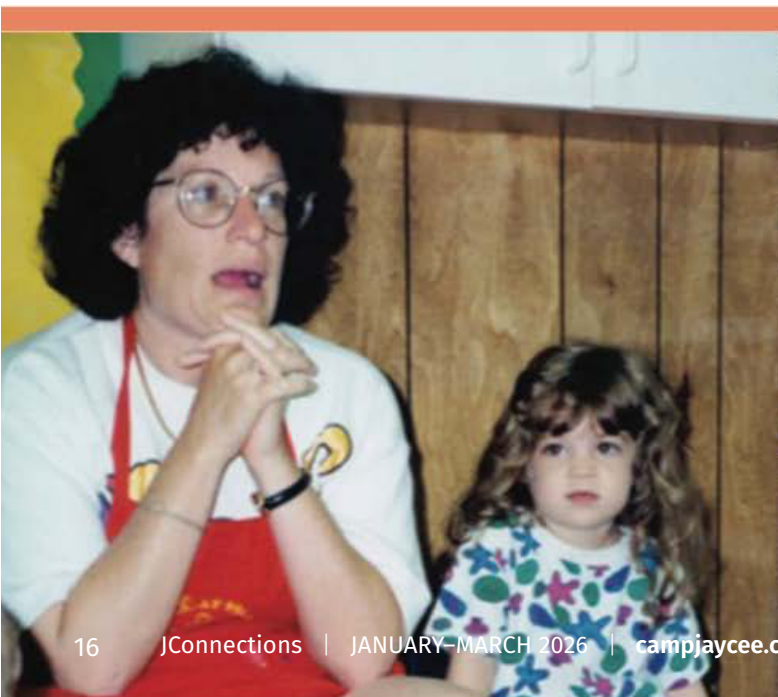
Lauren recalls her first impression, *"We were put together in the same group, and I didn't really think I was gonna like him—we have kind of polar opposite personalities."* But by the end of summer, it was clear their connection wouldn't fade with August. Summer may have been over, but their closeness stayed. *"We didn't realize how well we were going to keep in touch,"* Lauren says. *"We were still Skyping every day,"* a surprise to her, after what she assumed would be a short-lived summer friendship.

By their second summer, Gabe didn't want to leave the pairing to chance, so he made a quick stop. *"I think Sandy should get a shout-out,"* he says. *"I went into her office and said, 'Hey Sandy... I really want to be paired with Lauren... I know you're not supposed to do that type of thing, but come on.' Sandy laughed and said, 'Okay, back together.'"* As Gabe puts it, *"The first summer was random. The second one was with a little helping hand."*

Recalling certain moments from their counselor years, Gabe remembers Lauren leading the Hannah Montana "Hoedown Throwdown," and an 80s-themed workout day, complete with her mom's old VHS tapes and leotards. And there was the Mission Bay kayaking field trip where, by chance, neither counselor ended up with a camper. *"So we got to be in a kayak together,"* Lauren recalls. *"And everybody was racing, and we crushed it, being the only two 'adults' in a kayak."*

Years later, the heart of those summers still lives in their home. Their children attended Nierman Preschool, they go to JCompany shows as a family, and Camp Jaycee traditions live forward. *"Some of the songs we did during Shabbat, we still do with our kids... in the same tune,"* Gabe says. *"Our kids now are learning those from when we were camp counselors."*

Lauren and Gabe didn't meet as campers. They met as counselors. But the JCC shaped them long before that, and now shapes their children as well. **What began with a Hevra pairing became a relationship, a marriage, and a family growing into the same community that once brought two young counselors together.**





Robyn & Matt

Robyn and Matt met in the summer of 2003 at Camp Jaycee. Robyn was a unit leader for Gesher 1 & Matt was a counselor for Gesher 2. Robyn had spent lots of her life at Camp Jaycee and was excited for another summer of creating magic for kids. At the time, Matt was between years of law school and needed a break. Law was heavy, and camp felt like a breath of fresh air! His girlfriend at the time suggested he spend summer break working at a day camp to clear his mind of the educational stress. And that one suggestion changed his life forever.

That summer, Robyn and Matt became close friends. They laughed together, worked side by side, and got to know each other in the easy, honest way that camp allows. No pressure. No rush. Just long days, shared purpose, and a lot of laughs.

When summer ended, their connection did not. They got back in touch in the fall when Matt reached out, and Robyn was excited to hear from him. One conversation led to another, and soon enough, friendship turned into something more. They began dating in the fall of 2003, after the summer they became friends.

Three years later, they were building a life together and getting ready to move into their first home. One afternoon, they decided to visit the Gotthelf Art Gallery at the J. They knew the artwork was out of their budget, but they wanted to spend the day together, looking around and dreaming a little.

What Robyn did not know was that Matt had a plan. With help from Sandy, our beloved Camp Jaycee director, the J was cleared so they could have a quiet, private moment. In that space,

surrounded by art and meaning at the place they first met, Matt got down on one knee and asked Robyn to marry him. Sandy was the first to congratulate them, smiling at a moment she helped make possible.

For Robyn, the J was never just a place. Her mom was a preschool teacher, so the JCC had been part of her life from the very beginning. Camp, classrooms, friendships. It was home.

Today, Robyn and Matt have two daughters, ages 12 and 15. Their older daughter is celebrating her bat mitzvah next month! Both girls attend Camp Jaycee every summer & love every minute of it. They already talk about becoming counselors-in-training, and someday counselors themselves.

The magic of camp does not end with one summer, or even one love story. It carries forward; through families, through memories, through the next group of kids running across the field, forming friendships that may last a lifetime.

Robyn laughs when she says that Sandy played a role in bringing her and Matt together. But at the J, that kind of thing happens all the time. Camp creates space for connection, growth, and love.

Somewhere right now, a camper is meeting a future best friend. Or maybe something more. That is the magic of Camp Jaycee. And it keeps going, generation to generation.
